SECTION 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

NOTES TO PHYSICIAN

May pose an aspiration hazard.

SIGNS/SYMPTOMS OF EXPOSURE

Direct contact with eyes can cause irritation. Prolonged or repeated contact with product may cause irritation. Product spray mist, fog or vapor may cause irritation to nose, throat and lungs. If taken internally, aspiration of liquid product may cause pneumonitis.

HAZARDOUS DECOMPOSITION PRODUCTS

When exposed to fire, produces normal products of combustion.

UNUSUAL FIRE, EXPLOSION AND REACTIVITY HAZARDS

SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Have the product container or label with you when calling a poison control center or doctor or going for treatment. Describe any symptoms and follow the advice given.

IN CASE OF FIRE

Extinguisher Media: Foam, Dry Chemical, water

Special Fire Fighting Procedures: Treat as an oil fire. Use water spray to cool fire exposed surfaces and to protect personnel. Isolate "fuel" supply from fire. Use foam, dry chemical or water spray to extinguish fire. Avoid spraying water directly into storage containers due to danger of boilover. This liquid is volatile and gives off invisible vapors. Either the liquid or vapor may settle in low areas or travel some distance along the ground or surface to ignition sources where they may ignite or explode.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

IN CASE OF SPILL OR LEAK

If container begins to leak (through puncture, etc.), eliminate all ignition sources. Do not let spilled or leaking material enter watercourse. May be toxic to aquatic life. Absorb with oil-dry or similar inert material. Sweep or scrape up and containerize. This product contains the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) listed chemical *Pyrethrins* which has a reportable quantity (RQ) of 1 lb. A release of more than 15 gallons of this product is reportable to the National Response Center (800-424-8802).

PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Eyes: Wear splash proof goggles.

Inhalation: If working in enclosed spaces, wear a NIOSH approved respirator with an organic vapor (OV) cartridge or canister with any R, P or HE prefilter.

WASTE DISPOSAL METHOD

Full or leaking containers should be taken to a local disposal company for biological treatment or incineration. Whitmire Micro-Gen suggests that all Local, State, and Federal regulations concerning health and pollution be reviewed to determine approved disposal procedures. Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

Keep out of reach of children. CAUTION – Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reaction in some individuals. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Do not remain in enclosed areas after use. Remove pets, birds, cover fish aquariums and turn off air pump motor before spraying.

OTHER PRECAUTIONS

In health care facilities, remove patients prior to treatment. Thoroughly ventilate treated area for two hours before returning patients. Some furniture finishes, and particularly plastics, can be damaged by petroleum based insecticides. To avoid damage, cover those items and do not spray directly. If in doubt, test by applying this material to an inconspicuous area before spraying.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

STORAGE

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage. Store in a cool, dry area away from children, heat or open flame.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)
